

Nursing Professional Courses

The following course has had its course description updated.

Updated Course:

NUR 2000 – Family Centered Nursing

This is an Exemption by Exam course which is only offered to LPN students in order to determine if the student's accumulated knowledge is sufficient to be exempted from specific courses in the ASN Program. A passing score of 850 on the exam is needed for a NUR2000 course exemption. Nursing 2000 course content introduces the learner to the nursing care of the childbearing woman, family, and the neonate through adolescence, and includes nutrition and pharmacology as components within this course. Credits for this course are only offered to LPN after successful completion of the Pediatric / Maternity HESI examination.

Original Course:

NUR 2000 – Family Centered Nursing

Nursing 2000 introduces the learner to the nursing care of the childbearing woman, family, and the neonate through adolescence. Concepts based on the 3 domains of health & illness, nursing and healthcare, and the Massachusetts Nurse of the Future Nursing Core Competencies (NOFNCC) continue as the theoretical framework. The Concept Learning Modules introduce the learner to the specific needs of the childbearing woman, neonate, and child and nutrition and pharmacology continue as components within this course. Clinical experiences are selected so that the student learns to communicate effectively with assigned clients and practices within the legal and ethical framework of nursing. Includes 12 hours of clinical/skills laboratory and 4 hours of theory each week.

Prerequisite: LPN Licensure and successful completion of the HESI Fundamentals test and HESI Maternity/Pediatric test
